

Dog rose pendant



Materials

Fabric: e.g., faux leather, faux suede, or woven fabric

Stabilizer

Hoop (sized according to the ITH design)

Masking tape

Wooden sticks (optional) to secure the fabric

Scissors, rotary cutter (optional)

Wooden sticks



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General tips for your charm:

A dog rose gently winds its way across this charm. It doesn't mind at all whether it finds a home on your keyring or as a little bag charm on your favorite bag :)

- **Material:**

- Fabric:

- The pendant is finished with a satin stitch border. This gives you great freedom in your choice of material—whether woven fabric, faux suede, or outdoor fabric, simply choose the material you prefer to use.
 - If you use thin or soft material for the front, feel free to use a sturdier material for the back; this gives the pendant more structure.

- Yarn:

- Choose the thread colors entirely according to your taste and ensure they go well with the fabric.
 - Whether you create the embroidery in subtle or bold colors is entirely up to you.
 - If you use variegated yarn, the embroidery looks more dynamic.

- Stabilizer:

- Use the embroidery stabilizer of your choice.
 - We like using cut-away stabilizer; it gives the embroidery more stability.
 - Alternatively, you can also use tear-away stabilizer or wash-away stabilizer.

- **Cuts:**

- Fabric:

- Would you like to prepare the fabric for your pendant before you start embroidering? Then simply cut out two rectangles measuring 7 x 10 cm.

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Step 1:

Hoop the embroidery stabilizer drum-tight and load the file. Stitch the marking for the hair clip using embroidery sequence 1.

Step 2:

Place the fabric for the front of your pendant onto the stabilizer with the right side facing you, ensuring it completely covers the marking embroidered on the stabilizer. Secure it with tape or hold it in place with wooden spatulas while stitching. Stitch it in place using embroidery sequence 2.



Step 3:

Using embroidery sequences 3 through 6, stitch the design onto the pendant: first the flower filling, then the decorative details, the leaves, and finally the flower outlines.

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Step 4:

Turn the hoop over so that the back of the hoop is facing you. Take the fabric for the back of the tag and place it over the stabilizer so that it completely covers everything embroidered so far. Secure it with tape. Turn the hoop back over so that the front is facing you. Stitch the back in place using embroidery sequence 7. Then, embroider a satin-stitch loop onto the tag using embroidery sequence 8.



Step 5:

Now remove the excess fabric from the front and back by trimming it close to the outer edge of the outer seam.

Next, use embroidery sequence 9 to stitch a satin stitch around the outside of the tag, followed by sequence 10 to add a small decorative stitch on top of the satin border. This completes the embroidery process. Remove the embroidered piece from the hoop and completely remove the stabilizer.

Note: Alternatively, you can finish the embroidery first and then cut out the tag close to the edge of the satin stitch.



Now punch a hole in the satin loop – and your dog rose pendant is ready :)
